

Pentecost Sunday

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek word pentekoste, meaning 50th. It is celebrated on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus, ending the Easter season. Pentecost is recognized as the birthday of the Church. On Pentecost, Jesus' fulfilled his promise to send a helper, the Holy Spirit, to his apostles. The Holy Spirit transforms the apostles from fearfully hiding in the upper room to boldly and courageously spreading the good news of Jesus Christ our savior. On that day the apostles were understood in different languages (reversing the confusion of languages resulting from human pride at the Tower of Babel in Genesis). Peter converted 3,000 people that day. The mission of the Church given by Jesus to the apostles began and continues today. Matthew (28:19), "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." As disciples of Christ and members of the Church, we continue to be strengthened by the Holy Spirit through our Baptisms and Confirmations.

FIRST READING Acts 2: 1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God." HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. 
