Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time 9:30 AM Mass

Liturgy of the Word/Gospel

The Gospel reading is taken from the Gospel of Luke, Mark, Matthew or John. The Gospel is elevated over the other readings and is treated with extra honor and reverence because we encounter Jesus, speaking directly to each of us in his own words. The deacon carries the Book of the Gospels, in a special decorative cover, to the altar in the procession at the beginning of Mass. We stand for the reading of the Gospel. We sing Alleluia (meaning praise God in Hebrew) in joyful anticipation of the Gospel reading. The Book of Gospels is carried from the altar to the ambo before the reading. Only a priest or deacon, symbolizing the Church, proclaims the Gospel. We sign our forehead, lips and hearts before the reading begins showing our desire to receive the Word in our mind, proclaim it from our lips and keep it in our hearts. All these actions are expressions of the importance and our reverence for The Gospel. In the Gospels Jesus is shown to be the fulfillment of the promises of the Old Testament. We deepen our faith through encounter with Jesus and his teachings. He gives us guidance on how to live holy lives through his words and example.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10

In those days, the princes said to the king: "Jeremiah ought to be put to death; he is demoralizing the soldiers who are left in this city, and all the people, by speaking such things to them; he is not interested in the welfare of our people, but in their ruin." King Zedekiah answered: "He is in your power"; for the king could do nothing with them. And so, they took Jeremiah and threw him into the cistern of Prince Malachiah, which was in the quarters of the guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the cistern, only mud, and Jeremiah sank into the mud. Ebed-Melech, a court official, went there from the palace and said to him: "My lord king, these men have been at fault in all they have done to the prophet Jeremiah, casting him into the cistern. He will die of famine on the spot, for there is no more food in the city." Then the king ordered Ebed-Melech the Cushite to take three men along with him and draw the prophet Jeremiah out of the cistern before he should die.

PROFESSION OF FAITH
